Week 1 – February 26th

Our History & Founder

Attendees learn the foundations & early stages of the Republican party. We will also explore the Texas Constitution and the importance of Texas values. (1836 Project)

Week 3 – March 11th

United States Constitution, Parties, Elections, & Campaigns

Attendees learn about why the Founding Fathers added the Bill of Rights to the Constitution. We will also explore how representative self-government is achieved through the constitutional framework for elections, the Electoral College, the election process, political parties, and campaigns.

Week 4 – March 18th

Civic Participation, Public Opinion, Civic Associations & Interest Groups

Attendees learn about how public opinion shapes personal opinion & how civic participation can influence election outcomes. We will also take a deep dive into how civic associations & interest groups engage voters.
